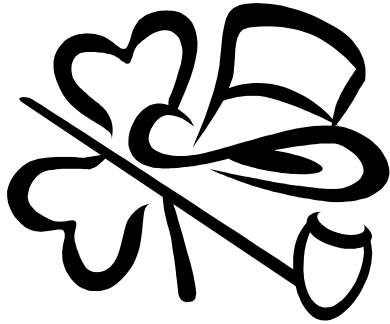

That seemed to show how proud he is of his Ohio roots! Joe recently returned to Lake Catholic to visit the school’s winter sports rally to present the first recipient of the Michael W. Jurevicius Memorial Scholarship, in honor of Joe’s son who tragically died three years ago. Joe is an eight year veteran coming off his best NFL season. Even though the Seahawks didn’t win the Super Bowl, our Timberlaker played a GREAT game and we are proud of him.

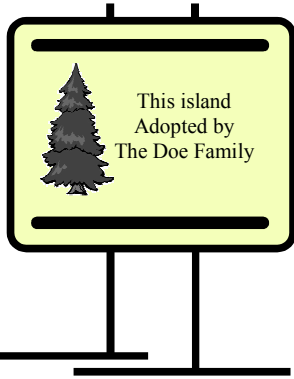

Adopt an Island or Garden Site

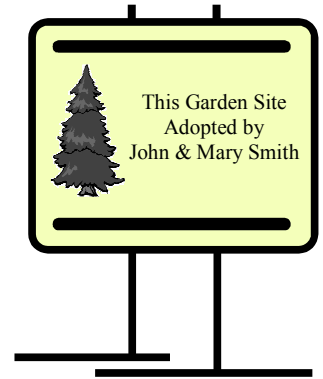

You will be notified of applicable rules when you adopt the site. Topsoil will be available and delivered by the Village if you wish.

Erin-Go-Braugh Potato Soup for Your St. Patrick's Day Bash

This soup is from Five Star Sensations Benefit Cookbook highlighting chefs who came to Cleveland to benefit University Hospitals of Cleveland, edited by Wolfgang Puck.

5 pounds (about 8 large) red potatoes, peeled, & large diced; 6 cups chicken broth;* 6 medium onions, finely dice; 6 stalks celery with leaves, finely diced; 1 large carrot finely chopped; 1/4 pound butter (1stick); 6 slices bacon; 6 cups half and half; 1 small jar (4 ounces) pimiento; drained and chopped; salt and freshly ground pepper to taste; 1-1/2 teaspoons minced fresh dill weed; 1 pound longhorn cheese

** For thicker soup, use only 4 cups chicken broth.

Put diced potatoes and chicken broth in stockpot, cook over medium heat until potatoes are almost tender. Sauté onions, celery and carrots in butter over medium high heat until soft but firm. Fry bacon in skillet until crisp. Crumble bacon; add to potatoes along with 1 tablespoon drippings. Add vegetables, stir in half and half, pimiento, salt, pepper and dill weed. Heat through but DO NOT boil. To serve, coarsely grate cheese in bottom of bowls before ladling soup. Leftovers make a great Clam Chowder if you add 1 can (6 ounces) chopped clams to every bowl of potato soup.
