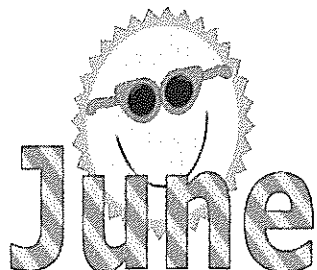


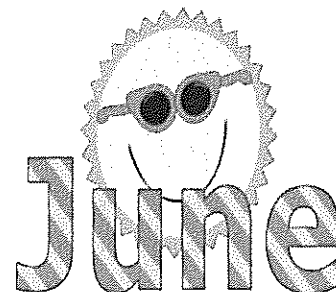

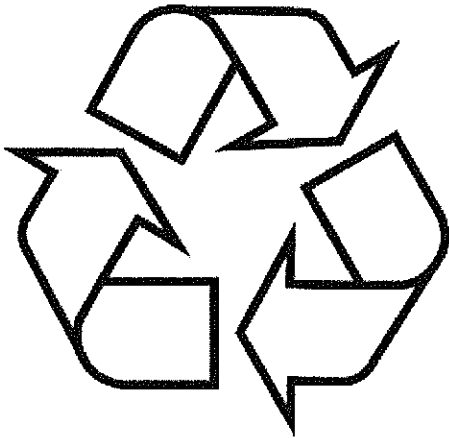

TIMBERLAKE COUNCIL MEETING

April 15, 2014

Mayor Cattani opened the meeting with the pledge to the flag at 7:35 PM. After the public portion, Mayor Cattani asked for the roll call of the officers.

All were present

Our Solicitor and Mrs. Stefaniak were also present

The mayor asked for a motion to approve April 15, 2013 minutes

Seconded: Ken Zalar

All were in favor

ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Mayor addressed the issue of sidewalks on Lakeshore Blvd. The village was attempting to apply for a Community Development Block Grant money to put a sidewalk in on Lakeshore. Unfortunately the village was unable to get income data that was needed to qualify and apply for the grant for this year. The village is looking for alternative funds through the state for possibly a bike path in that area.

The roads in the village got worse over the winter. The village is still working with Lake Line to get documents to get the grant point needed. Pete Formica is working to get the drawings needed to be submitted for the grant. Submission for the grant should happen in the next few weeks. We should find out about the middle of July whether the village will receive a grant for the roads. This grant would be for repaving the entire village. This grant would be from Public Works money.

The village is still waiting for United Survey to get back with the hard numbers for cleaning and televising. This will tell us how much root cleaning that will be needed.

BOPA will meet on May 28, 2014 to continue with sanitary sewer cleaning bids to get a schedule of cleaning started.

SAFETY

Ken Zalar presented Resolution 2014-18 confirming the appointment on a probationary basis of Chadwick Thompson to the position of Arson Investigator in the Village of Timberlake Police Department.

Chadwick Thompson was sworn in. Patrolman Thompson will be involved in an arson program in Lake County with the local fire departments.

Ken Zalar said that he and Chief Esser, with our new police car, were in the Police Memorial parade on May 15th in Cleveland.

Chief Esser gave a monthly report on the police departments traffic stops and citations. The Chief also discussed getting involved the Shop with a Cop program. This is a program set up for underprivileged children in the Lake County area. This program is sponsored by outside donations from different retail establishments and personal and corporate donations. This program includes, back to school shopping and holiday shopping. The Marines are also involved with this program.

Chief Esser also reported that the police department is also stopping by the playgrounds to talk to the children to get acquainted with each child. Bicycle patrolling is also going to start up.

SEWERS

Jim Gasier reported that he is still receiving bids for the storm sewer cleaning/clearing project. Over by Todd Mahaffey there was a 60 foot blockage between two man hole covers. Mr. Gasier had Erie Side come out and they were able to break through some of the blockage so there is now some flow. This area has scale and root problems in the storm pipes. There are also some broken sections in this area. This is part of United Surveys report. These repairs are out for bid and bid selection should be made soon.

SERVICE

Mike Stanton reported that the service department now has a staff of three. We have a college student in for the summer to help with the seasonal cleanup. The service department is still trying to road patch the trouble parts in the village. The islands and flower beds will be cleaned up, adding new top soil and mulch. Plantings will be made with deer repellent plants. The medians will be repaired from the winter damage. The police department will help with the service department with traffic control with the work to be done in the different sections in the village. The service department is currently repairing the mowing equipment to get started. A dumpster will be brought into the service department to get rid of the old trees and branches in that area.

The Mayor has been contacting the state and county road departments with regard to the unfinished paving on Lake Shore Blvd. with respect to the road grinding into the aprons

of the villages streets. The project was discontinued two years ago which has now caused the shoulders on our street entrances to crumble. The mayor is trying to get the state to come out and repair these areas.

TOWN HALL

Ritu Sharma reported that rentals are still continuing to come in and she is still inviting quotes from electricians to get the new exit signs installed.

FINANCE

Dennis Dicki reported that at the end of April he and Lisa went to Brecksville for a financial program the state hosted. The state had financial experts talk about finances in small governments throughout the state. Dennis and Lisa had a chance to talk to other people who are involved in handling finances in other communities. He felt it was a very worthwhile program hosted by the State of Ohio.

Dennis Dicki presented Resolution 2014-19 approving and directing payment of certain bills by the Village of Timberlake, and declaring an emergency. These are the monthly payments.

Mr. Dicki will be talking to individual council members regarding the budget for next year. Lisa received paperwork from the state auditor this week for the 2015 budget. The 2015 budget hearing will be July 15th at 7:00 PM.

TREES AND PARKS

Mary Trepal reported that they had a tree commission meeting on May 15th. The village will be divided into four zones. Each member will be in charge of a zone to inspect the trees to look for diseased, dead, or trees that need pruning. They will meet again in June to discuss their findings and how to proceed. The people on the tree commission said that they would be willing to answer questions from the residents who might be having problems with trees in their yards. Their names and numbers will be put in the Timberlake Times and the web site.

The summer program is going well with 10 children already registered. The teachers already have their schedules planned. Trips are being arranged.

The park still needs mulch in places.

The mayor said that if anyone has property maintenance issues or questions to please call Ruth Marshall at 440-796-3936.

Mike Stanton presented Ordinance 2014-11 amending section 1260.10, side yards, of the code of ordinances for the Village of Timberlake and declaring an emergency. This

ordinance was put on first reading. There will be a public hearing on July 15, 2014 at 6:30 PM

First Energy Coal Dust Problems?

While particulate pollution from the power plant exhaust stacks is minimal these days, many residents still experience problems with coal dust blowing over from the coal pile. Typically this occurs when the winds come from the north, or when their yard excavators are grooming or changing the shape of the coal pile. If you have coal dust on your home, patio furniture, boat, camper or cars, First Energy continues to offer a free program for remediating the problems. The Claims Line for First Energy is 440-546-8785. Typical services provided (through local contractors) are power washing of homes, patios and patio furniture, as well as washing or detailing of vehicles. This may be the last year this service is available, so residents are encouraged to consider their situations and file a claim if appropriate.

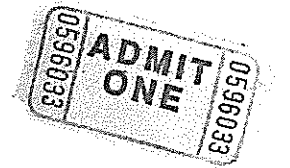

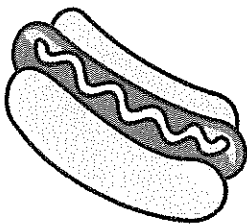

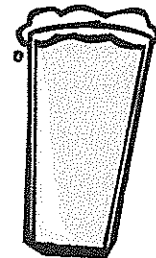


For every \$5.00 donated, 1 ticket will be placed in the raffle. This fundraiser is to support village activities.
