BARBECUE PORK BURGERS

There's no bones about it! Makes 4 patties.

Heat the grill to medium-high. In bowl place 1-1/2 lbs. pork, 1 small red onion, minced, plus slices for serving, 1/4 cup barbecue sauce, (your favorite sauce), 1 teaspoon coarse salt, & 1/4 teaspoon black pepper. Mix very gently with fork to combine, being careful not to overwork meat (which would make burgers dense). Gently form meat into 4 patties, salt & pepper both sides of patties, place on oiled grill, grill until cooked throughout, (do not press down on patties) 5-8 minutes per side.

Serve on (toasted on the grill) onion rolls with sliced onion and remaining barbecue sauce. (To make more patties mix each 4 patties batch separately.)

EASY BARBECUE SAUCE FOR BARBECUE BURGERS

In medium saucepan heat 2 tablespoons vegetable oil. Add 1/4 cup finely chopped onions, cook, stirring until onions are soft, about 5 minutes. Stir in 1/2 cup ketchup, 1 tablespoon each dark brown sugar & red wine vinegar & 1 teaspoon chili powder. Bring to simmer. Remove from heat, stir in 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard. Brush each burger every few minutes with a generous amount of sauce. Serve on onion rolls.
