2015 Village-Wide Pavement Resurfacing Notice

Please be advised that the resurfacing of the village streets commenced September 28. The project consists of milling the existing asphalt material off of the roadway and then placing a new asphalt concrete overlay. This work will require the closing of certain roads to traffic while the milling and paving operations are active. Traffic will be maintained at all times while work is in progress, and all roads will be open/accessible when work is not being performed. Work will continue until the end of October. We apologize in advance for the inconvenience and will expedite the work as quickly as possible. **Please be sure to put all trash out by 6AM this month, as the Republic trucks will be coming early to avoid the road construction activity.**

TIMBERLAKE COUNCIL MEETING

September, 2015

Mayor Cattani opened the meeting with the pledge to the flag at 7:32 PM. After the public portion, Mayor Cattani asked for the roll call of the officers. All council members were present, besides Dr. Sharma and Mrs. Trepal who both had excused absences, along with our Solicitor and Mr. Roskos.⁴

The Mayor asked for a motion to approve August 18, 2015 Council Minutes.

The Mayor announced that on September 3rd, Mary Trepal resigned from her position as a council person after serving for nearly X years. Ms. Trepal put many hours into creating, organizing, and training the Tree Commission along with implementing systems for tree issues, including emergency tree removal. She also helped beautify the Village Park and spent much of her time providing great service to the Village. The Council has 30 days to appoint someone, after which the task falls on the Mayor.

SEWERS

Mr. Gasier reported the 3 bids he received on repairs of the storm sewers. Integrity Sewers estimated \$32, 990, Landco-Germano Construction Company estimated \$32, 600, and Formica Plumbing and Sewers estimated \$23, 000. The project will take about 6 days to complete and will be starting on the week of September 28th, which will allow enough time to fix before road construction can begin. Peter Formica said the company will fix all 8 points identified in a matter of 4-6 days.

Mr. Gasier introduced Resolution 2015-47, authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract with the lowest bid, Formica Plumbing and Sewers.

Mr. Gasier also reported that there was about 2.5" to 3" of water the past week and one flood call.

SERVICE

The Mayor informed that there were some alternative bids for the pavement. Initially, the bidding was for 1" of milling and 2" of laying asphalt. Currently, the contract is for \$665, 000. Option 1 allows for a 2" mill with 2 layers of asphalt which allows for less gutter issues; the cost of this is an additional \$56, 000. Option 2 allows for a 2" mill with the original 1 layer, which would be an additional \$40, 000. Another option was to mill out 1 ½" while putting back 1 ¾", which deducts \$8000. The last option would be a deduction of \$1000 off the original price by getting only 1 ¾" of asphalt rather than 2". Peter Formica recommended either opting for the current option or going with the alternative option one, as the more layers that are done, the smoother the road. All roads will also have crowns to pitch the water off and Mr. Formica will be inspecting the work throughout the construction process. He also believes that this new option will not affect the schedule of the construction. It should be done within the same time frame, but allows for greater compaction of the asphalt

Mr. Stanton introduced Resolution 2015-48, authorizing the Mayor to opt for alternative option 1 by modifying the contract but not to exceed the original bid.

Mr. Stanton informed residents that the "Slow, children at play" signs are now up, after the poles from previous signs were recycled for the new signs, which allowed for cost reduction.

SAFETY:

Chief Esser provided the monthly police report, citing 77 house checks, 81 park checks, 18 beach checks, 22 traffic reports, 2 criminal reports, 24 minor incident reports, 4 traffic related reports, and 6 criminal reports. The chief also informed residents that certain police officers were currently undergoing testing for Certification in regards to Terminal Agency Coordination. The Police Department phone lines are now fixed, as well.

FINANCE

Mr. Dicki presented Resolution 2015-49, accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the Budget Commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the County Auditor.

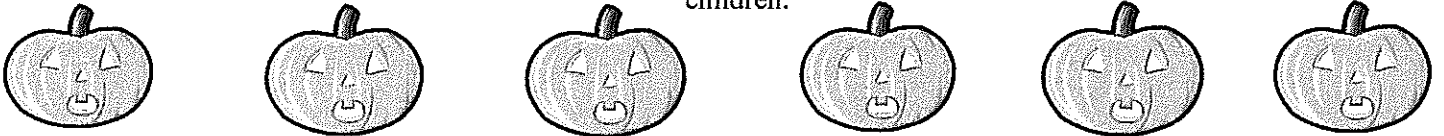

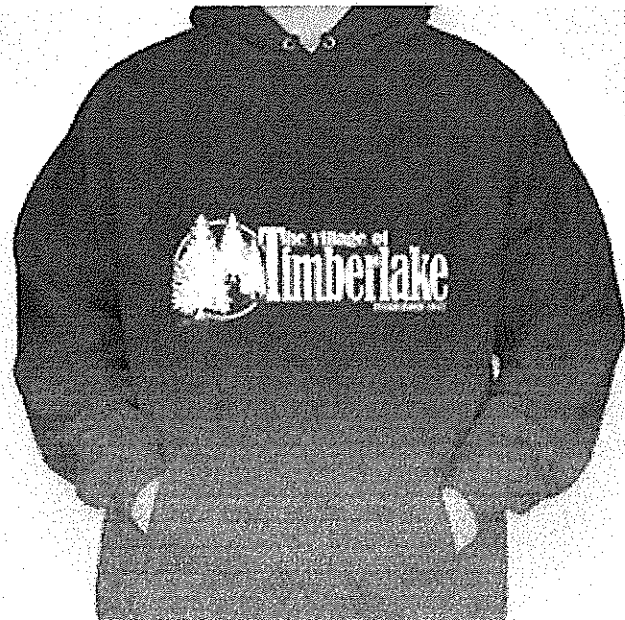
