## Christmas Eve Luminaries

Once again our Village will be aglow on Christmas Eve! To all the volunteers, THANK YOU for keeping alive this tradition. Thanks also to the Mayor and Timberlake Council for your financial support.

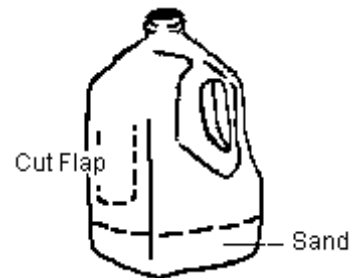
Luminaries for median and islands will be delivered to the volunteers during the week of December 17<sup>th</sup>.

There is a desperate need for volunteers to display luminaries on the islands at Minnewawa/Keewaydin; Keewaydin/Nakomis; and Minnewawa/Shawondassee. Supplies will be provided.

To those of you who have pre-ordered candles, they will be available for pick up at my house, 4 East Shore Boulevard, on December 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. The cost is \$1.25 per dozen. **Cash only, please!**

Instructions for making luminaries are as follows:

Using a clear plastic milk jug, cut a “U” shaped flap in one side of the container. Put about 2” of sand in the bottom of the jug for weight. Discard cap. Place candle in sand. Place the luminaries across front yard and along driveway. Light at dusk. A small butane lighter works well for lighting candles.



**To keep this tradition going, I am asking for volunteers to light candles on the median and islands. It takes nearly a thousand milk jugs, sand and candles. If you can help, please call me. Thank You!**

There is a limited supply of sand available at the service garage. Bring your own container and help yourself.

### In Memoriam



Dr. Mark Balin, a longtime resident of Minnewawa and the first anesthesiologist in Lake County, passed away October 17, 2006. Born in Warsaw, Poland, he received his medical degree from the University of Warsaw and his diploma in anesthesiology from the University of Paris while working in the Rothschild Hospital. During World War II Dr. Balin fought as a member of the Polish Resistance. His life was marked by his bravery and determination. In 1943 he was shot by the Nazis and fortunately he made a full recovery. But in 1973 he was shot again by a robber while attending an anesthesiology convention in New York City. He was partially paralyzed after that attack. He and his wife lived in their lakefront home for many years. He was survived by his wife, Dr. Jeanine Balin, two daughters and seven grandchildren. Our deepest sympathies to his family.

Sympathy to Nephawin Road resident Ruth Fulton on the death of her brother, Harry R. Flick, on November 10, 2006. He was a U.S. Army Veteran and retired from TRW after 45 years. Mr. Flick, who resided in Mentor-on-the-Lake, was also survived by a son, a step-grandson and many nieces and nephews.

Condolences to Nona Rowles on the death of her sister, Ann L. Campbell of Painesville on November 13, 2006. She was a switchboard operator for 21 years at Geauga Hospitals. Mrs. Campbell also was survived by a daughter, a grandson, a great-grandson and two brothers.

## Chocolate Salami

This is a unique contest winning recipe. It won first place because it was so weird. It has a rich chocolate flavor and there is no meat in it. The mixture of ingredients, from the crushed butter cookies to the candied fruit is what gives this cookie the look of a popular Italian meat. You can expect about 15 slices of this chocolate dessert.

1/2 cup raisins<<<7-oz. semisweet chocolate chips>>>3 T. butter>>>6 T. sugar>>>3-oz. plain almonds, finely chopped>>>7-oz. butter cookies, crushed>>>3 T. mixed candied fruit>>>  
2 egg yolks, beaten>>>Powdered sugar for decorating

Soak raisins covered in warm water until needed. Put chocolate chips & butter in double boiler over simmering water until melted. Do Not Let The Chocolate Touch the Water. Add sugar, almonds, cookie crumbs, drained raisins & candied fruit. Mix well, remove from heat. Immediately stir in beaten egg yolks, then let mixture cool completely. Form mixture into a long salami shape by hand. Cut sheet of wax paper large enough to cover salami. Place salami in center. Sprinkle powdered sugar on all sides of salami, then seal with wax paper. Refrigerate for at least 3 hours. Before serving, remove wax paper and cut the salami in slices. Arrange slices on serving dish.

When you have egg whites left over in any recipe, whisk the whites and make an egg white omelet.

## Holiday Safety

Please remember to be cautious this holiday season to prevent fires. Select trees that are fresh and green. Needles should not break when pushed back. Do not put your tree near a heat source, including a fireplace or heat vent. This will cause the tree to dry out and be more susceptible to catching fire.

Inspect your lights each year for frayed wires, gaps in the insulation or bare spots or cracked sockets. Do not use any lights with these signs of wear. Don't overload electrical outlets. Do not link more than tree strands together. Don't leave holiday lights on unattended. Test your smoke detectors monthly to ensure they are working properly.
